NEW BOOKS TO THE MEDIA CENTER

Jerry and Jean Harris have donated six books to our Media Center collection.

JOSEPHUS by Norman Bentwick - Josephus wrote many books about Jesus and Judaism. He is considered one of the most knowledgeable authorities of Jewish history. The author aims to present Josephus from the Jewish point of view in this book.

THE GOOD BOOK - READING THE BIBLE WITH MIND AND HEART by Peter J. Gomes - Reverend Peter Gomes uses humor, insight and compassion to help the reader understand the Bible in his or her world. He begins the book with an explanation of the Bible's literary interpretation. He covers a variety of subjects and shows how the Bible is a powerful way to bring us closer to God.

THE THEOLOGY OF THE HAMMER by Millard Fuller - This book is the story of the author working with many other people to provide suitable housing for under privileged people. He believed that all shacks could be eliminated and with guidance people could learn how to own their home.

FIRST LIGHT by Bodie and Brooks Thoene - This book is fiction, but the authors use historical events to portray the story. The setting is Jerusalem. The people of Jerusalem wonder if they will ever be delivered.

A FUNNY THING HAPPENED by B.E. White, Jr. - The author may make you feel different emotions as he tells stories about church people and funny things that happen at church. The author enlightens the reader about changing time in North Carolina for three quarters of a century.

THE LANGUAGE OF GOD by Francis S. Collins - Dr. Collins give a solution of how God and science works together and can be harmonious.
